From the PASTOR

Answers in Genesis:

What Happened to the Dinosaurs?

For the past two months in SaltTeens we have gone through some studies by Answers in Genesis. One of those studies took a look at the extinction of dinosaurs. Let me engage your mind for a few minutes as we look at a view very contrary to what many of us learned in our science classes in school.

If you were to ask a zoologist why so many animals go extinct each decade they would give you answers like: destruction of their environment, disease, food scarcity, genetic problems, natural disasters. These are all legitimate reasons for extinction, but if you then asked them, "So, what happened to the dinosaurs?" The most common response is, "No one really knows." To me that sounds like a contradiction. Animals become extinct all the time, but for some reason, the dinosaurs are a mystery.

According to the secular timeline dinosaurs came about 235 million years ago and then died out millions of years before man. However, this does not fit with a Biblical worldview that God created everything at the same time. The Bible tells us that on the 6th day of creation, God created all the animals that lived on land, which would include dinosaurs. This would mean that humanity and dinosaurs came about at the same time, not millions of years apart.

OK, so maybe they did come about at the same time, but is there any proof in the Bible that dinosaurs lived at the same time as people? There are actually several passages in the Old Testament that speak of giant "sea monsters" that live in the water (Psalm 74:13,14, Isaiah 27:1). The book of Job speaks of the "leviathan" in chapter 41 and the "behemoth" in chapter 40. The Leviathan is thought to be something like the 40ft "Super Croc" or even the 82ft Liopleurodon. Some have speculated that the behemoth is an

elephant or a hippo, but part of the description of this beast tells us that the tail is like a "cedar." As far as most zoologists know, no hippo or elephant has ever had a tail like a "cedar." However, many of the dinosaurs did. These are just four Scriptural accounts that appear to imply that dinosaurs lived during the same time as people.

Wait a minute, so, if the dinosaurs lived along with people in Biblical times, then what happened to them? Some have speculated that the flood did most of them in, but the Bible tells us that two of every kind of animal went onto the ark. Not every animal had to be an adult in size, so some of the dinosaurs could have fit onto the ark if they were juveniles. Also, looking through the fossil record indicates that there are actually only about fifty different kinds of dinosaurs. These two points along with what we know about genetics tells us that the dinosaurs could have survived the flood and increased afterward. However, living after the flood would have been a very different story.

Today, many creationist scientists speculate that an ice age occurred after the flood due to the excess water and drastic changes in climate. These environmental changes, changes in food source, and changes in temperature would be enough to wipe out species today, so it is very plausible that the dinosaurs died out after the flood. However, they may not have died out completely because there are accounts of dinosaur like animals being seen and documented as recent as the 1970s.

I'm willing to bet most of you have never heard this information before or at best only a portion. I hope I wetted your appetite to find out more, because I only scratched the surface in this article. You can find out more about what happened to the dinosaurs in *The New Answers Book 1*, found in our church library.

 - d. Expenses for the year are in line with the year's budget. Bev is pleased with the accuracy of the boards in estimating their budgets.
 - e. The Boards are encouraged to have their budget proposals turned in by October 3rd. This will give Bev time to prepare the reports for the October council meeting.
 - f. The council with a unanimous vote accepted the minutes.
- V. Board of Finance – Scott Ladwig
- a. They are keeping a close eye on the fluctuation of the general fund.
- VI. Board of Education-Terri Enlow
- a. Pastor Seth Forness will be teaching "The Wired Word" for adult Sunday school.
 - b. The board would still like to find another teacher for an additional adult Sunday school class in Glyndon.
 - c. A Nursery Coordinator is needed to organize volunteers to staff the nursery during the 2nd service in Glyndon.
 - d. The Vacation Bible School offering will go to the AFLC church in Naknek, Alaska to begin a Vacation Bible School program up there.
- VII. Board of Worship & Music-Charity Erickson
- a. Pastor Appreciation Sunday is scheduled for October 9th in both Glyndon and Ulen.
 - b. They will be adding a new line item to their budget to fund our 25th Anniversary celebration.
 - c. Pew cards will begin distribution soon

It includes a 15 yr crack-cocaine addiction, losing custody of all five of her children, and the depths of physical violence. Compounding all of this was the fact that she is a daughter of the legendary Ray Charles who was recently named #2 on the 100 Greatest Singers of All Time by Rolling Stone Magazine.

When she finally surrendered to God's will, she was at her lowest point and desperate for relief from the personal pain she had created. She transparently shares her story and amazing testimony of God's greatness with heart-warming stories and powerful vocal selections, connecting audiences to the power and love of God along with the flavor of the past of her father Ray.
