



# Maranatha News

### FROM PASTOR LLOYD...

The angel answered and said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; and for that reason the holy Child shall be called "**the Son of God**." (Luke 1:35)

Dear friends at Maranatha,

Why and how did it come about that we celebrate Christmas? We, who have never known a time when Christmas was not celebrated, and who have lived our lives with all kinds of Christmas traditions, may assume that since the birth of Jesus Christ over 2000 years ago such celebrations have always taken place. However, while yearly Easter celebrations link back close to New Testament days, celebration of Christmas came significantly later.

In New Times, Christians experienced severe persecution and death at the hands of Roman government officials. However, the Roman Emperor named Constantine was sympathetic to Christianity, and in 313 AD made a declaration known as the Edict of Milan – which made it illegal in the Roman Empire to persecute Christians. In 325 AD he convened the Council of Nicaea, which gathered a group of Christian bishops to clarify what Christians believe regarding the person of Jesus Christ. There was a bishop named Arius from Alexandria Egypt who taught that Jesus was not divine, but rather a created being. A result of this council is the Nicene Creed (which we traditionally recite at Christmas). The Nicene Creed is a bit longer than the Apostle's Creed, and goes into much more detail about the person of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and His relationship to God the Father and to the Holy Spirit.

The first historical record of Christmas being celebrated on December 25 traces back to the reign of Constantine and the year 336 AD. (So, not many years after that historical Council of Nicaea firmly settled the doctrine of the divinity of Christ). There are various theories on why Christmas landed on that date, including the possibility that it lined up with the pagan date of the winter solstice in the Roman Empire, and the festival birthday of "the Invincible Sun." (Winter Solstice, by the way is the day of the year with the least hours of daylight, after which days begin to get longer again.) So Winter Solstice was looked on as the birthday of "the Sun."

It is interesting that the Old Testament Prophet Malachi spoke of the coming Messiah and stated this concerning Him: *"But for you who fear My name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its wings; and you will go forth and skip about like calves from the stall."* (Malachi 4:2)

Regardless, of the factors that shaped the celebration of Christmas landing on December 25<sup>th</sup>, our celebration of the birth of Jesus emphasizes that we believe what the angel declared to the virgin Mary - "*The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; and for that reason the holy Child shall be called* "*the Son of God*."

During Advent at Maranatha in Glyndon I will be preaching on the first chapter of the Gospel of Luke. There we will look into the annunciations of the angel Gabriel to Zacharias and to Mary (foretelling the birth of John the Baptist and of Jesus). These annunciations and the subsequent births of John the Baptist and Jesus Christ reveal the awesome plan of God to send His own Son to be our savior. I look forward to celebrating the season of Advent and Christmas with you, as we gather for worship each Sunday in December.
