While all of this is concerning, it also gives us direction. First, it directs our focus as to how we should be praying and what we should be praying for. The church needs revival. Second, it reminds us of the accuracy of God's Word which tells us these days would come. Third, we have to keep our eyes upon Jesus Christ and His life-giving victory on the Cross (Matthew 16:18). And in the midst of all this, we worship the Lord Jesus Christ and wear it on our sleeve presenting a positive and hope-filled message wherever we might go, first and foremost before our families and then to the lost world. Remember...

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by Him all things were created, both in the heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things have been created through Him and for Him. He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together. He is also head of the body, the church; and He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that He Himself will come to have first place in everything. For it was the Father's good pleasure for all the fullness to dwell in Him, and through Him to reconcile all things to Himself, having made peace through the blood of His cross; through Him, I say, whether things on earth or things in heaven. - Colossians 1:15-18 NASB

FROM PASTOR PETER...

In the last century, an earthquake hit America's moral foundation. Absolute truth was rejected with relative truth taking its place. Johnny Cash's 1970's song, *What Is Truth*, reflects still the fruitless search when the absolutes in God's Word are abandoned. No longer is the Word of God the basis and standard of truth, but instead man's feelings relative to the situation at the time. A large percentage of Americans have been raised in an environment where there are no absolute truths.

Those of us raised under the security of absolute truth might wonder what is going on with justice in America, among other things. The answer is found in God's Word. The prophet Isaiah wrote of a time when Israel experienced the results when just one of the pillars of a civilization crumbles.

Justice is turned back, and righteousness stands far away; for truth has stumbled in the street, and uprightness cannot enter. Isaiah 59:14 NASB

When truth stumbles, there is a ripple effect that goes with the force of a tsunami that follows an earthquake below the sea floor. There are tremors that will happen at every level of a society causing upheavals that man cannot anticipate.

A casualty of no absolute truths is the inability of a justice system to make moral and fair decisions. With no absolute truth, there is no basis for fair justice. Unlike absolute truth, relative truth accommodates the emotions and philosophy of the individual. When there is no righteousness established outside of man himself, a man-centered righteousness becomes the elusive standard. In other words, what is right is relative to the beliefs of the one making judgments. And woe to the man or woman who would seek to defend absolute truth. "Yes, truth is lacking; and he who turns aside from evil makes himself a prey," Isaiah writes in verse 15.

Unfortunately, the stumbling of truth has happened not only in the street. Truth has also stumbled in the church with far reaching effects.

In November of 2021, the PEW Research Center released a report of the current beliefs of Americans regarding heaven and hell. When asked if a person who does not believe in God can go to heaven, 45% of all Christians responded yes. One in five evangelical Christians believe that those who do not believe in God can go to heaven. 58% of US Christians believe that there are multiple religions that lead to heaven. Ugh.

Another study by the Barna Research Group, revealed only 32% of born-again Christians believe in moral absolutes. Among teens it's even less (9%). If so, then it means a large portion of the church has accepted practices that the Bible identifies as sin. Equally detrimental is the church has hamstrung itself from fulfilling its mission – evangelizing a lost world that searches for the truth. Any church in which a large share of its fellowship does not believe in absolute truth and that there are multiple pathways to heaven has muzzled its message.

A Christian not believing in absolute truths denies the absolute necessity that Jesus Christ is the Savior of the world. "I am the way and the truth and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me." John 14:6 If this is surrendered, the fervor and the confidence to evangelize lost souls does not exist. And if absolute truth is lost, so too the sense of obligation to seek the lost. With Christians believing there are multiple religions that lead to heaven, Christianity in America now hosts about 58% of its participants who have a heretical understanding of who Jesus Christ is and why He had to come. Some of them teach Sunday School to the next generation, some of them are leading our youth groups, some lead our worship teams, some teach in seminaries and some of them fill the pulpits of churches in America.
