

From Pastor Peter...

The Cross – God’s Instrument of Love

Way back as a small boy, when I still thought all girls had ‘cooties’, I regretted the middle of February. That was because I dreaded the prospects of having to exchange those little punch-out cardboard Valentine cards with girls at the class Valentines Party, girls of whom I really did not want to be my Valentine. That haunted my thoughts until the day had passed and the Valentines Party was over. As a young boy, I was taking things way too serious. Such an expression of affection to ask a girl to be my Valentine seemed dishonest and way too mushy. Today, I would be diagnosed as not being in touch with my softer side. The only elixir to the dread I was experiencing was the prospects of a chocolate heart or two. To a chocolate junky, it was the opiate for my troubled soul.

And then there are some who grow into adulthood, still unable to express love. They cannot express it because they do not have it. The Bible, especially in the New Testament speaks much about love. When we ponder what Scripture teaches us about love, we come to realize we love only that which is of value to us, be it a person or a thing. In Matthew 6:21 Jesus tells us that where our treasure is, there our heart will be also.

We know that we love what is of value through the One we confess as our God and Savior. In John 3:16, Jesus tells us of our own value from God’s perspective which is ultimately measured and proven through the Cross of Calvary, “For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son...” This wonderful declaration of love tells us where our value comes from. Our value or worth can be measured by who loves me and how that love is expressed. Ultimately that is God and the death of His Son. A person’s absolute worth comes from how God sees me, not from anyone or anything else. While we all want to know we are valuable in the eyes and hearts of all we know, we know that should those other relationships fail, whether through my fault or the failings of someone else, it does not decrease my value in God’s eyes, “for while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.” To the troubled person suffering from a broken relationship or living under the constant belittling criticism of another, the Gospel speaks volumes of why, in spite of failures, they are of great worth...God loves them. For all of us, our worth is found at the cross of Calvary. Jesus Christ’s death proves our worth as born out by His sacrifice of love.

It is only when a saving faith in Jesus Christ exists and is being cultivated by a continual diet of the Gospel, can someone begin to see the worth of another person through the eyes of Christ. This is the way the Lord means our coexistence in the church is to be. His church universal but especially in the local congregation. I heard it once said that my love for Christ is no greater than my love for the person in my life who I dislike the most. We tend to put worth, even on our brothers and sisters in Christ, based upon how much they agree with me, how much they do for me, how much they like me and other ways of the flesh. In 1 John 5:1-3, the litmus test of a personal and living relationship with Jesus, is being able to see someone else through the eyes of Jesus Christ. And in John 13:34, Jesus simply says to, “Love one another as I have loved you.” That can only happen in a heart growing in the wonderful reality that Jesus Christ loves me.

In 2000, the recording group, The Statler Brothers recorded *The Other Side of the Cross*. Is there someone in your circle of fellowship toward whom your heart is cold, perhaps someone sitting two pews up in church, an extended family member, a co-worker, a neighbor? Someone you really don’t want to be your Valentine. Perhaps we all need to see each other from *The Other Side of the Cross*.

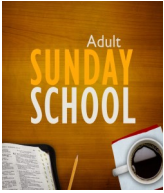

- use of a substance (drugs, alcohol, food & etc.)
- the practice of a behavior (anger, shoplifting, gambling, pornography use, compulsive spending, TV watching & etc.)
involve an unhealthy relationship with another person which we call co-dependence. **There is hope!**

Living Free small groups' help participants gain insight into how a life-controlling problem develops and how it can be overcome through a relationship with Jesus.

Living Free groups are transforming the lives of men and women in Fargo-Moorhead. There are sessions going on that you can connect with at any time. Go online to jailchaplains.com for listing of classes or you can talk to Sheila Smith at Maranatha-Glyndon if you have questions.
