





FROM PASTOR PETER...

An assassination attempt upon one presidential candidate and the forced withdrawal of the current elected president by his own party. No wonder most people have a low view of politics and future leadership in America right now. We are tired of the rancor on display in our beloved country. It would seem every four years two highly motivated groups of people are dedicated to proving correct one journalist's satirical assessment of those running for office; "The Democrats are the party of government activism, the party that says government can make you richer, smarter, taller, and get the chickweed out of your lawn. Republicans are the party that says government doesn't work, and then get elected and prove it." P J O Rourke American Journalist and Political Satirist.

It is hard to keep a biblical perspective and maintain balance in the drama of presidential elections. We want a change to a more positive and godly way of life instead of the decline many believe we are in. Most look to the voting booth as the means to bring about that desired change. Yet fear and pessimism reign in the hearts of those anticipating what will come if their preferred candidate or party does not win the election. Even believers must guard against what might seem like a hopeless future if the right candidate does not win. Israel made the mistake of anticipating that the Messiah to come would be their political Savior.
